- 3 years of landfill left only active site at Mugga Lane no other reserves
- David Roberts, Project Manager
- Aim to increase resource recovery from 75% to 90% by 2025. Currently 1m tonnes of waste.
- To duplicate facilities would cost \$30m
- Mugga Stage 5 is in valley to rear of current landfill
  - To cover to 2035
  - Requires
    - environmental impact statement
    - Community consultation
    - Timetotalk.act.gov.au
