

# TCC weighs into drug test debate

The Tuggeranong Community Council (TCC) has entered the debate over the introduction of Random Roadside Drug Testing in the ACT with the launch of an online public survey.

President Darryl Johnston said the survey would seek to determine community opinion on drug driving and the introduction of random roadside drug testing in the ACT.

Mr Johnston said the survey was open to all Canberra residents and the findings would be used to shape a TCC submission to the ACT Government on the issue.

Random roadside drug testing has been a controversial issue in recent weeks, with Labor and the Greens not supporting a bill by the Liberal Party to give police the powers to randomly test drivers for illicit drugs in their systems.

Labor has sought public comment on a discussion paper on roadside drug testing, which is available at [tams.act.gov.au](http://tams.act.gov.au), and has stated it will release a draft legislation of its own in the near future.
