# **President's Report: Glenys Patulny**

- Christmas period: focus on bus interchange due to reports of youth anti-social behaviour (north-side and south-side). Increased patrols in Tuggeranong interchange.

# **Tuggeranong Hyperdome Update** – Jeremy Wilson

- Centre has changed ownership on December 2016.
- Anketell street development for upgrades. Paint job and new metal grill on the front of Anketell street. Outdoor seating structure to promote a new dining precinct; encouraging night life.
- New retailers will be moving in next year (March 2018).
- Re-arrange seating structure in Anketell street late January.
- New customer lift near JB-HI-FI for customers. As well as amenity upgrades for JB-HI-FI and Big W.
- Upgrades for entrances (Coles, Australia Post) early next year (2018).
- More seating in the Centre.
- Retailers have made investments in their stores. Retailers include: Westpac, OPSM, Ali Baba, Specsavers, Espresso Room.
- Consulted with a design firm for advice on the centre's streetscape and art.
- Pay parking machines moved internally within the centre for better security.

# Anketell Street Upgrade and Tuggeranong Town Centre Public Transport update - Ben McHugh and David Matthews

#### Ben McHugh – Capital Works

Capital works projects and Transport Canberra projects.

- Create a more pedestrian and cycling friendly area in Anketell Street as part of the upcoming upgrade.
- Shared path near South Quay. Designating space for all the users in that shared zone.
- Planning to start upgrade in first quarter of the year, predicted completion by Christmas 2018.
- Laneway upgrades to connect the town centre to the lake foreshore.
- Designs to be completed within the next 6-7 months.
- Light feature designed by landscape architect; to provide structure and lighting in traffic area.
- Planning to have parking bays for bicycles.
- Consultation with building owners and retailers to encourage private sector growth.

# **David Matthews – Transport Canberra**

- To extend opportunity of Rapid bus service throughout Tuggeranong region.
- Objective is for Anketell Street to become a pedestrian friendly area.
- Traffic data: Around 9% of identified traffic on Anketell Street relates to bus movement.
- Options: Proposal to move buses would create delays and could affect the overall time timetable.
- Possible Option: There is the potential to redesign the bus interchange so buses go to and from the interchange via Pitman Street – bypassing Anketell Street entirely.
- Belconnen Westfield has 3 smaller interchanges around the centre.
- Possibly minimise services in Anketell Street for "not-for-service" and dead buses, however, this will require consultation with bus workers' union.
- Re-designing bus network in 2018, aiming for 15 minute or better services (Blue Rapid). Services to go to Barton and Russell. Frequency of Blue Rapid service to be increased across the 7am to 7pm period rather than just during peak hours.
- There are trade-offs that need consideration. For example, the closer the bus stops are to a person's home the longer the journey time will be. However, a linear bus service can burden disadvantaged users.
- No decision made as yet on a connection between Hume and Tuggeranong Town Centre, need to determine patronage and demand.
- Consideration for transport connection to public housing, areas of interest include: walkability to and from the bus stop; lighting and footpaths.

- Proposing to hold a Youth Engagement Forum in 2018, Term 1.
- Intention to utilise Survey Monkey to help gather data from schools across areas of interest to students.
- Help finalize a YWCA Canberra program for Christmas activities in Tuggeranong.

## - Community and Health:

- Community awards for adults to commence February 2018.
- Planning an event in conjunction with other Tuggeranong community groups (including YWCA Canberra and Tuggeranong Arts Centre) linked to development of Anketell Street.

# - Planning (Hamish Sinclair):

- Two Sub-divisions proposed for Hume in the future. Hopeful, there will be a bus connection between Hume and Tuggeranong.
- Guilfoyle House consultation.
- Sports and eco precinct for broader stakeholder forum.
- Approach Minister responsible for planning to review heights of the town centre.

#### **Other Business:**

- Two Cases in Bonython in a Seniors Housing complex where there were possible fire hazards.
- For community members interested in singing, Tuggeranong Sing Australia meet at the United Church Erindale on Monday afternoons from 1pm to 3pm.
